

NEVILLE 'JESSE' JAMES



Toowoomba RSL Sub Branch farewelled a dedicated member when Neville James passed away on 14 June 2021.

Neville John James enlisted in the Australian Army on 6 Jan 1960. During his service with 4RAR, he was involved in the Borneo Confrontation and the Malayan Emergency before discharging on 15 Aug 1977.

Nev was elected to the Toowoomba Sub Branch Committee of Management in 1996, and served as Deputy President, Secretary, & Membership Officer at various times. One of his greatest achievements was leading the Funeral Team which was formed in 1997. After Jim Danskin took over the role of leader in 2005, Nev continued to be a valued member of the team until ill health intervened. He transferred his membership to the Middle Ridge Sub Branch for a time in the mid 2000s where he also served as Secretary. His contribution to the life of the Sub Branch, and his service to his fellow veterans saw Nev awarded Life Membership of the League in 2019. In a fitting tribute to their mate, our Sub Branch Funeral Team conducted the Poppy Service and were there surrounding Nev during his final farewell.

Once again the generosity of our community came to the fore, and within days of appealing to the public for help, we had pledges to cover the cost of the remaining markers from people around the district. I am continually being blown away

by the kindness and willingness of our community to step up and support numerous worthy causes. Much of the credit for seeing this project to fruition must go to Lindsay Morrison who is passionate about ensuring our local servicemen are appropriately honoured.

Some more good news— we have recently received funding to undertake some improvements at the Hub including the installation of a ramp at the front entrance which will make accessing the venue easier. This ramp will be portable & will be removed once our tenancy ends. We will also be purchasing some play equipment for the backyard so that all the family can come & make use of the facilities.

It was a privilege to be involved in the morning tea for the Barnes family where we unveiled the portrait of our late member Vincent Barnes back in June and more recently the informal get together for some of our Vietnam veteran members when new member Des Politch was presented with a full set of reissued medals to replace those he lost in the 2011 floods.

I have felt for quite a while that our organisation could perhaps be doing more to reach out to our female members, partners of members and friends including the lovely ladies on our Citizen's Auxiliary. So it was a great pleasure to organise the bus trip to Warwick for the 'Jumpers & Jazz' festival which I hope will be the first of our 'girls only' activities & events. Ladies— I would love to hear from you if you have any suggestions as to what you may like to do in the future.

On the membership front, I have continued to welcome a steady stream of new members over recent months & have been kept busy processing applications & sending out new member kits.







This initiative started in Victoria a few years ago as a way to reach out to defence personnel touched by war and the immediate families of fallen soldiers. The project was so successful that it was decided to continue presenting quilts to any veteran, or the family of a deceased veteran, who served their country.

The quilts are made by a network of volunteers around Australia, with each quilt a symbolic gift presented to the recipient along with a covering letter and certificate. A HAPPY ENDING FOR ONE MEMBER

When the floods devastated Toowoomba in 2011, there were many residents who lost homes & precious possessions. For one of our newer members, the floods washed away all record of his time with the RAAF in Vietnam including his medals and all his service records. OUR KINDRED ESO'S IN PROFILE



The first in a series that highlights the vital support and services provided by our colleagues in other local ex-service organisations. This time we focus on Legacy.

- * Legacy began in 1923 shortly after the end of World War One. It was started by a small group of young business & professional men who shared common service in the AIF, mostly in the Victorian 24th Battalion. It was modelled on the Remembrance Club formed in Hobart by Sir John Gellibrand to help former comrades who were struggling following the war.
- * Toowoomba Legacy was formed on 22 Dec 1945, & received its charter as a Legacy Club on 8 Mar 1947. Currently it has 400 widows & 12 children in its care, predominantly from the Toowoomba region as well as Dalby.
- * Legacy's purpose is to build & maintain the morale of each family in its care, enabling each family member to live an enriching life following the loss of a current or former serviceman, be they a husband and/or father. It also assists by ensuring widows & children are soundly advised & where necessary provided financial assistance.
- * An important role that Legacy performs is to alleviate the loneliness of elderly widows by providing opportunities for social contact, as well as easing the load on a widowed mother who may be sole parent to young &/or teenaged children. Legacy helps with education & training to ensure children are guided to become responsible citizens.
- * The keynote of Legacy's work has been personal service by each member of Legacy to the families requiring assistance. Each Legatee gives of their time, energy and experience voluntarily to look after families allotted to them, providing advice on Legacy's facilities, the range of support available, & offering assistance to access entitlements especially through DVA. They can be invaluable during the early bereavement period when they can assist with the administration of the deceased veteran's estate as well as offering advice regarding pensions, superannuation, payment of debts etc. Legatees come from all walks of life, many with previous military service although this is no longer a prerequisite for membership.
- * Legacy receives no assistance from the Government and relies on the generosity of the public along with fundraising such as the annual Legacy Badge Appeal. 100% of every donation goes to supporting its dependants.
- * The local Legacy Club is located at Suite 8 /4 Mylne St, Toowoomba phone 4632 2352.
